

NORTH BEND CITY COUNCIL MINUTES

April 1, 2014

Senior Center, 411 Main Ave. S., North Bend, Washington

CALL TO ORDER, ROLL CALL:

Mayor Hearing called the regular meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Councilmembers Present: Cook, Gothelf, Kolodejchuk, and Pettersen. Councilmembers Loudenback, Rosen and Williamson were excused.

Councilmember Gothelf **MOVED**, seconded by Councilmember Kolodejchuk to amend the agenda to include a presentation by Police Chief McCulley regarding the Criminal Transient Camp Location Team. The motion **PASSED** 4-0.

Councilmember Gothelf **MOVED**, seconded by Councilmember Pettersen to approve the consent agenda as presented. The motion **PASSED** 4-0.

CITIZEN'S COMMENTS:

Travis Bridgman, 713 Ogle Ave NE, commented on a recent visit to the middle fork of the Snoqualmie River and mentioned compliments he received from local children about his good works at area parks.

Celia McNay, 13121 455th Place SE, spoke regarding the proposed developments near SE Tanner Road. She requested the following proposals be considered to preserve the area: 1) No SE Tanner Road entrance for proposed Segale development or other future developments, 2) No new houses constructed on SE Tanner Road, 3) Leave berms and trees in place near Segale development and on SE Tanner Road, and 4) City review of environmental impact as a whole on all proposed development in the area.

Terry Tatko, 13124 455th Place SE, spoke regarding the recent tragedy in the Oso Valley of Snohomish County and noted similarities between Oso Valley and the Snoqualmie Valley, particularly as it pertained to potential landslides. She elaborated on the impact of new development to the natural environment and infrastructure of the City and commented that citizens were counting on Council to do everything possible to ensure the safety of the residents of North Bend.
