## Paper



Dirty paper, facial tissue, disposable diapers.  
*(Put in bag and tie shut.)*



Ribbons, foil wrapping paper



Food-soiled frozen food boxes & plastic coated cardboard



Hardback books  
*(remove & trash cover, recycle pages)*

## Plastic



Plastic hangers



Empty motor oil & antifreeze containers



Candy wrappers, chip bags




Plastic plates, utensils & straws



Empty prescription vials



Styrofoam food trays, plates, cups, and take-out containers.



Styrofoam packing peanuts & bubble wrap  
*(Reuse)*

## Glass



Mirrors, window glass, ceramic dishes, incandescent & halogen bulbs  
*(No fluorescent tubes/bulbs.)*

## Metal



Dried-out latex paint containers, empty non-toxic aerosol containers.  
Remove lids.



Metal hangers, sharp or greasy metal

## Animal Waste



Double bagged pet waste & cat litter  
*(Do not place pet waste & cat litter in the organics cart.)*

## Miscellaneous



Vacuum cleaner bags



Cold cigarette butts & ashes  
*(Put in bag and tie shut.)*



CDs & CD cases


## Do Not Place in the Garbage

- Recyclables
- Reusables
- Compostables
- Hazardous Waste

Weight Limits:

20gal – 30 lb	64gal – 120 lb
32gal – 60 lb	96gal – 180 lb

Do not secure lids with bungee cords. Lid must close or extra charges will apply.



# Organics

Yard waste, food scraps, and food-soiled paper only

## Easy food scrap recycling

- Keep kitchen container near the sink
- Add food scraps and food-soiled paper
- When full, empty into your yard waste cart
- Get a free compostable bag sample, visit

Holiday trees & greens  
(4' long, bundled, no flocking/decorations.)



Grass clippings, weeds, leaves, tree branches, twigs, roots



Houseplants  
(No pots.)



Dairy products  
(Cheese, yogurt, etc.)



Coffee filters & grounds, tea bags, tea leaves



Meat, fish, poultry, bones



Fruit & vegetable scraps, leftovers, pumpkins  
(Remove produce stickers.)



Bread, pasta, grains



Eggshells, nutshells



Uncoated paper plates, cups, food wrap, bags\*



Paper grocery bags, paper egg & berry cartons  
(No plastic or foam.)



Greasy pizza boxes, wax coated cardboard, paper towels & napkins



Shredded paper\*\*  
(Layered & no plastic.)

\*Uncoated paper does not have a shiny surface.

\*\*Shredded paper can be layered between food scraps and yard waste to absorb liquids and keep odors away.

## How to prepare your yard debris, food scraps, and food-soiled paper:

- No plastic bags.
- Paper bags or Cedar Grove-approved compostable bags are ok.
- Food scraps and food-soiled paper can be recycled only in the organics cart supplied by Republic Services.
- Extra yard waste can be collected in paper bags, 32 gallon cans, or 3'x3'x3' boxes. Extras not to exceed 32 gallons or 60 lbs each. Must be labeled "Yard Waste."
- Limit: One cart plus three extra bags or bundles.



# Recycling

Clean and dry material only

## Paper



Newspapers, inserts, magazines, catalogs, phone books



Advertising mail, envelopes, mixed paper



Clean, empty plastic coated cartons, beverage containers, coated paper cups, & boxes



Cereal, clean paper cups & dry food boxes  
*(Remove liners.)*



Wrapping paper  
*(Non-foiled.)*



Flattened cardboard  
*(3' x 3' x 3' or smaller.)*



Paperback books  
*\*Tip: Donate to charity if in good condition.*

## Plastic (Please clean and rinse containers)



Clean plastic food containers & cups



Empty milk, water, juice & pop bottles



Empty plastic bottles  
*(All colors; labels ok.)*



Lids 3" or larger  
*(Remove from containers, rinse.)*



Clean plastic plant pots



Rigid Plastic  
*(Place in or next to recycling container.)*

## Glass



Bottles & jars *(Empty & rinse, labels ok.)*

## Metal



Lids 3" or larger; Scrap metal; and small metal appliances (2'x2'x2' or smaller and less than 60 lbs. Place on top of recycling container.)



Clean aluminum & metal cans, clean foil & foil trays

## How to prepare your recyclables:

- No food waste, liquid, loose plastic bags. Bag all plastic bags together.
- DO NOT bag recyclables; leave loose (except where noted.)
- Remove all lids from containers & no lids less than 3 in.
- Put additional recyclables in sturdy bins, boxes, large paper bags, or 32-gal. cans marked "Recycle" next to your recycling cart; not to exceed 60lbs each.
- Recycle up to three 1-gallon containers per pick up of used cooking oil or kitchen grease. Place in clear, screw-top plastic jugs, labeled with your name and address. For pick up, no motor oil is allowed.
