 - Look at wayfinding sign to park. Consideration for other similar signs.
 - e. Bicycle Tollgate Farm Park Trail from SVT to W North Bend Way:
 - i. **Stop 8** (approximately 7:30): Tollgate Farm Park trail at undercrossing of Ballarat Ave. N. (901 Bendigo Boulevard N.)
 - North end of future pedestrian pathway along Bendigo Boulevard N. and bridge/boardwalk over Ribary Creek, bridge over S. Fork Snoqualmie River).

 - Future shared use pathway along Bendigo Boulevard S. Hotel to address outlet mall frontage, new outlet madditional missing links to address as municipal project.
 - ii. **Stop 11** (approximately 7:55): Bendigo Boulevard S. at Mt. Si Boulevard/Outlet Mall exit.
 - Future roundabout currently in design.
 - Project does not extend across I-90 onramp, which will need to be a future separate project.
 - iii. **Stop 12** (approximately 8:00): Intersection of Bendigo Boulevard. S. and W. Ribary Way.
 - Consider roadway directional signage to Tennant Trailhead Park.
 - Future pedestrian/bicycle improvements to be addressed with development of property fronting this intersection.
 - iv. **Stop 13** (approximately 8:15): Gardiner Weeks Park.
 - ARPA project – Paved pathway connecting Senior Center to Snoqualmie Valley History Museum and additional ADA picnic tables on pads.
- h. Return to City Hall:
 - i. **Stop 14** (approximately 8:25): Si View Park entrance at Park Street.
 - Si View plans for reconfiguring area, new pedestrian pathway and driveway entry.

Minutes of the North Bend Parks Commission Meeting of April 22 , 2024

Minutes are draft until approved at the following Parks Commission Meeting

The meeting, held in person at North Bend City Hall, was called to order at 6:33 p.m.

Attendance:

- Parks Commissioners in attendance: Tim Talevich, Kyle Braun, Eric Thompson, Brian Duncan, Minna Rudd and Matt Miller. Absent: Kaylie McGhee.
- Staff in attendance: Principal Planner Mike McCarty

Minutes of the Jan. 24, 2024 Parks Commission Meeting

Commissioner Miller made a motion to approve the minutes. Commissioner Thompson seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Guest: Terry Pottmeyer

Resident Pottmeyer gave a review of the Oaktoberfest tree planting last year at EJ Roberts Park. The focus at the event was regarding plants that have a positive environmental impact; for the event, two Garry Oak trees were chosen. Pottmeyer explained that the goals are to promote education and enjoy. Pottmeyer reported that the participants from last year are willing to come back with their booths for an event this year. She also showed the "Treemendous Trees" nominations/posters which she would like to repeat this year.

For 2024, she would like the event to be inside at the Meadowbrook Interpretive Center and on Oct. 19, which she is coordinating with the Meadowbrook Farm Preservation Association. The challenges will be to do a better job getting the word out; engage additional participants and volunteers; and expand more tree nominations.

In the ensuing discussion, talk focused on having a food or coffee truck, a possible North Bend booth explaining environmental efforts, and having the Frisky Girls farm participate. Pottmeyer requested support from the city in having arbor day activities on that day. Principal Planner McCarty responded that he would look into any permits needed.

Small Parks Improvement Budget

The 2024 Small Parks Improvement Budget has \$15,050 remaining. The Commission discussed these options:

1) 2-hoop bike racks in the downtown area. The Commission is supportive of this plan, with comments to make sure they don't interfere with new garbage and recycling cans, pedestrians or opening car doors. Recommended locations are two racks in front of Volition and two more nearby.

2) A directional roadway sign to the new Tennant Trailhead Park. Senior Planner McCarty said signage would be fairly easy to do in this budget. It was suggested that the sign be brown like others in the city related to parks; a location of Ribary and Bendigo Boulevard

was noted as a good location. It was also suggested that such a sign might be helpful at the new Dahlgren Family Park. McCarty said he would research costs.

3) Picnic tables at the pump track at Torguson Park. It was noted that we need to research ADA access for this project, and if a concrete pad is needed. The maintenance crews might have a recommendation about the best location.

4) Public parking signs at the public stalls adjacent to Torguson Park behind Phoenix Plaza. Commissioners supported this, and McCarty reported he can order four signs.

At the end of the discussion, Commission member Rudd recommended that all items be brought back for approval when we have more information.

Annual Tour of Parks

This year's tour will take place on May 13, starting at 6 p.m. at City Hall.

Survey/Outreach for Park Planning Topics

This topic was tabled until Commission McGhee is back.

Informational Updates

McCarty gave an update on these topics:

- The Tenant Trailhead ribbon cutting drew a big crowd. Some of the project still needs to be completed, including restrooms and plantings.
- At the Dahlgren Family Park, some projects still need to be wrapped up. The pickleball courts will soon be under construction, with one court for now. A canoe artist will paint the canoe.
- For the Meadowbrook Farm Prairie Loop Trail, a firm is moving forward with schematic design, with construction hopefully this fall.
- For the pedestrian/bicycle and utility bridge adjacent to the wastewater plan, the bridge is in design phase, and the Commission may see conceptual plans in their June meeting.

Public Outreach Options

Commission member Rudd reported that the Farmers' Market has open dates for a city booth on July 25 and Aug. 15.

Adjournment

The meeting was adjourned at 8:24 p.m.

Lucas and Craig,

Following up on your inquiry about additional bike racks downtown in the vicinity of Volition, our Parks Commission is supportive of purchasing additional bike racks for the downtown area from the Small Park Improvements Budget. However, Public Works has taken a look at the available sidewalk area and determined that there is insufficient room to accommodate the racks within the sidewalk area in front of Volition without bikes interfering with car door opening space and also ensuring needed ADA clearance within the sidewalk space itself (the other similar racks in the downtown are at the intersection bump-outs where there is more sidewalk width). The alley adjacent to Volition also doesn't have sufficient width to place bike racks. Therefore there are two alternatives for getting more bike racks in the vicinity of Volition.

1. City could place additional racks at the bump outs at the block ends (either in front of Cascadia Pizza food trailer lot, or in front of Cook Real Estate), but not in front of Volition.





2. You could place your own (privately owned) bike rack within the building setback/inset area where the Volition storefront is. This area is on private property rather than within the right-of-way, so that would be up to you.



Let us know if you if you wish to place a bike rack yourself, or prefer that the City just adds racks within the public sidewalk area at the block ends.

Rebecca,

Using the Small Park Improvement Budget (001-000-076-576-80-35-01), the Parks Commission has requested purchasing 4 bike rack hoops, approximately 3' tall, surface mount, black powder coated. These are for the downtown, 2 parallel hoops in front of Volition Brewing, and 2 in front of Heartwood Coffee. I've gathered estimates from 4 suppliers below for similar products. The least expensive option is the Uline rack, 1st one below. For 4 hoops, cost would be \$1060, plus estimated \$78.26 in shipping. Total of \$1138.26 (I can't tell if tax is already in that amount.) Let me know if you are good with me using my City Credit card to order these.

Here are the estimates from 4 suppliers for similar products:

Mike,

Following up to park sign discussion from the parks meeting. The Tollgate Park blade sign was part of the work completed by the contractor, so I don't have access to the cost for the sign. However, we did receive the design file from the project design team, which could be used to get pricing information from vendors. I can forward the file, if you'd like.

I'd like to propose an overall signage program discussion as a future meeting agenda item as this has been on the workplan for some time. It would be helpful to get cost estimates for both a single sign order (to fulfill immediate need with Tennant) and bulk order (for parks listed below) to inform parks commission on whether proposed project could be considered from the small parks budget or requires longer term planning such as a decision card request.

Directional signage program purpose: On-street blade signs for motorists, bicyclists and pedestrians approaching a local park destination. Design to match existing park entrance signs. Directional signage that matches the park entrance signs provides connectivity in between

destinations and supports cohesive park branding.


